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Indulgences Galore!

As many, if not most, Lutherans are aware, a key aspect of the Reformation was Martin Luther's Ninety-five Theses against Indulgences. In the Roman church's way of thinking, if one sins, one has two problems. First, one violates God's ordinances, and second, in such sinning one creates some type of damage which needs to be addressed.

So, if Sally steals Billy's basketball, Sally has broken the commandment "Thou shalt not steal," and Billy is deprived of his basketball. So, Sally needs to go to her priest and confess her sin of stealing for which she will receive absolution. Billy, however, is still in need of a basketball. So, the priest may assign Sally the task of returning Billy's basketball or of having Sally buy Billy a new basketball or of having Sally do some sort of penance, such as saying ten "Our Fathers" (the Lord's Prayer) or perhaps 15 "Hail Mary's," which is more appropriate if Sally had stolen Billy's football. With the last option, Billy is no better off, but Sally has "made up" for the damage to Billy.

Now, if Sally would have died before making restitution for depriving Billy of his basketball, Sally would not pass Go and would not collect \$200. Instead, Sally would end up in purgatory. Purgatory is a hell like place where one is "purged" of one's remaining deficiencies in order to be pure enough to gain entrance into heaven. The difference between purgatory and hell is that people do not get out of hell, not even with a "Get Out of Hell" free card. This is so because the pope has a monopoly over purgatory but not over hell.

Thankfully, in AD 1300 the Vatican started issuing Jubilee indulgences every 25 years, whether people needed them or not. The Vatican can also issue indulgences at other times. An indulgence reduces one's time in purgatory. Indulgences can be earned for oneself or can be applied to others languishing in purgatory. This is good news, unless one believes that Jesus Christ in his life, death, and resurrection has secured our salvation which through the gospel is given to sinners by grace alone through faith alone as a free gift. Viewed from that position, an indulgence by contrast is a scam which effectively negates Christ and his salvific actions. Notably, the Vatican does not let such things like God, Scripture, and so forth get in its way.

This is a particularly good year for indulgences. On 13 May 2024, the Vatican announced the "Decree on the granting of the Indulgence during the Ordinary Jubilee Year 2025 called by His Holiness Pope Francis." One can earn this indulgence by making "I. Pilgrimages," by making "II. Pious visits to sacred places," and by doing "III. Works of mercy and penance." Under the last category,

"The Jubilee Plenary Indulgence can also be obtained through initiatives that put into practice, in a concrete and generous way, the spirit of penance which is, in a sense, the soul of the Jubilee. In particular the penitential nature of Friday can be rediscovered through abstaining, in a spirit of penance, at least for one day of the week from futile distractions (real but also virtual distractions, for example, the use of the media and/ or social networks), from superfluous consumption (for example by fasting or practising abstinence according to the general norms of the Church and the indications of the Bishops), as well as by donating a proportionate sum of money to the poor; ..." Nowadays, one cannot buy indulgences, like in Luther's day, but if one makes a financial donation, one gets credit as good as a purchase, so to speak!

For those who cannot wait until 2025 to get an indulgence, on 09 July 2024, the Vatican issued the "Decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary on the granting of the Indulgence on the occasion of World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly." In this case, the Pope "graciously grants the Plenary Indulgence from the heavenly treasures of the Church, under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff) to grandparents, the elderly and all the faithful who, motivated by a true spirit of penance and charity, will participate on 28 July 2024, on the occasion of the Fourth World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly, in the various functions that will be held throughout the world, a Plenary Indulgence that may also be applied as a suffrage to the souls in Purgatory." As it is now August, did you miss this chance to earn this indulgence?

In short, in 2024 indulgences galore await you and your loved ones, even those in purgatory! All you need to do is to cast Christ aside and do something helpful to effect your own salvation or that of another or both! Being such a savvy saviour yourself makes you a "little Christ" If you are a Christ, then you are as good as God, and that is exactly what the Serpent promised to Adam and Eve, "For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil" (Genesis 3:5).
